Course Fees: 560 Euros (56 hours of guided tuition over 7 days)

Organisational Support: 100 EUR per participant

We provide pedagogical and intercultural support, daily monitoring during the course, validation of learning outcomes, certification, and validation of Europass Mobility.

Individual Support:

Your National Agency will decide on the daily Individual Support rate you can claim. The range for courses in Italy is 90 – 160 EUR per participant. The application form will automatically populate these figures, based on the amount of days you have included in the application.

We charge an all-inclusive fee of 160 EUR per participant per day. This will include private ensuite accommodation, all meals and local travel to the course venues and heritage sites we use.

International Travel: The grant also includes an amount to contribute towards costs of getting participants from their home to the hotel in the course destination. This is calculated based on the distance that participants need to travel. We can advise you how much this will be from your country.

Applying for a course

We will work with organisations to provide guidance on completing and submitting an application to your national agency. The organisation should apply for multiple places over a 1-2 year period, which can be on the same course or spread across different course dates.
